Acts Resource Center started in 2011 through the efforts of a couple of families. They were interested in helping the people of Mounds and the surrounding area that had clothing needs. It quickly grew into a resource center that provides clothing to the community once a month, and clothing and other resources to Foster Families by appointment. All clothing and resources are provided FREE of charge to those in need. Here are some ways you can help:

- Sort and hang-up clothes monthly organized volunteer days and also Facebook impromptu days as needed.
- Donate clothing kid's clothes and adult clothes. NEW underwear and socks for kids are always
- Volunteers to help with clothing distribution. ACTS is open to the community on the 3rd Saturday of every month from 1pm – 3 pm. Opportunity to interact with the community.

Since the clothing and services are provided free of charge, ACTS is also in need of financial partners. Donations can be made to the Mounds Community Development Association (501c-3) designated for the **ACTS** Resource Center.

Good Samaritan Health Services (GSHS) provides free, quality medical care to people in the areas of most need through the use of two mobile medical trucks and hundreds of volunteers. Through 15 different clinic locations in the Tulsa area and surrounding communities, GSHS offers 55 monthly clinics that cared for 6,500 patients in 2012. There are a variety of volunteer opportunities to serve at their mobile clinic locations. Volunteer needs include medical professionals (doctors, nurses), clinic volunteers (interpreters, intake desk, runner, medical assistant – intake/vitals), individuals to pray with patients, professional services to maintain the mobile clinics (mechanical, heating/air, electrical), and special event volunteers.

Other Ministry Ideas

- 1. Family Movie Night. Host an outdoor movie night in your neighborhood or city park as a way to serve and get to know your neighbors and others in our community. The LOTF has an outdoor movie setup (12' outdoor screen, Fender 500W speakers, projector, blu-ray/dvd player) that can be checked out for events like this.
- **2. Community Garden.** Use your "green thumb" as a ministry by developing and organizing a community garden as a means to build relationships with families in the neighborhoods around FBC.
- **3. Tutoring.** Most public schools and ministries for at-risk kids are looking for adults to help tutor kids. A great opportunity to impact students and potentially their families.
- **4. Adopt A School.** Contact a local school principal and inquire about how you can support the teachers and students in their school. Use these opportunities to serve them and build relationships that will open doors to further ministry.
- 5. Street Ministry. Make a bunch of sack lunches, grab some bottled water, and setup in the downtown area to feed the homeless. Distribute blankets and other items useful to the homeless. Take the opportunity to get to know them, hear their stories, and build relationships that will provide the opportunity to share about the hope you have in Jesus Christ!
- **6. Car Clinic.** Organize and promote a car clinic to provide minor car repair/maintenance for single moms, elderly, or others in need.
- **7. Adopt A Neighborhood.** Organize volunteers to help clean-up yards, or do minor maintenance for those unable to do these things for themselves.
- **8. Nursing Homes.** Contact local nursing homes about opportunities to help with activities/events, organize special events, host bible studies, and make regular visitations, or other ways to develop relationships the residents.
